#### Focus areas for 2023

This year we are aiming to develop academies of excellence by extending our curriculum areas and opportunities for students. To achieve this we have 5 focus areas as a school, for staff and students.

- 1. **Hauora/Mindfulness**; Research shows that children will gain and grow more as learners when they (mind and heart) are in a calm state. Teachers are providing different approaches throughout the day to achieve this.
- 2. **Cultural capabilities and development**; This is a government interest area and priority. As part of our teacher inquiries this year, we will be learning more about our history, our land and our people. This is inclusive of all cultures.
- 3. Leadership; Students will be lead through a strengths based learning approach. This is where the individual strengths of the learner are recognised and nurtured. The approach also applies to staff, where we provide the best learning opportunities possible based on the strengths of the teacher.
- 4. **Professional learning development**; teachers will pursue PLD that is relevant to our students needs and focus areas for 2023.
- 5. Integration; learning in the classroom will be connected across curriculum areas. The STEAM classroom as at the heart of this learning and teachers provide the experiences for their students.
