Welcome to our second newsletter for 2024.

Our school calendar is packed with a strengths based curriculum between now and the end of the term. We have many EOTC events planned, house leader selections, sport events, music lessons, the opening of our Tui Cafe and the opening of our new bike track at school.

We have our highest roll ever for this time of year, with a current roll of 567 students. To give a comparison, this time last year we were sitting on 525 students. A high roll is a positive sign, however, it does mean that we may need to change systems in our school to keep children safe. One system we have is the early pick up of new entrant children from room 22, which is at 2.45pm. Your support with these initiatives is appreciated, and next term we will need to look at adding a second class to this arrangement.

Paid Union Meeting - Thursday 21st March

All teachers in New Zealand who are union members are being called to a paid union meeting during term 1. The meeting date for our teachers is on Thursday 21st March. Our goal is to remain open on this day to avoid an early pick up at 12.00pm or closing altogether. It is important to note that the classroom programme on this day will not be normal and teachers will be covering other teachers across the school for this to work.

Travelling to and from school

Welcome to Term 1. To ensure a smooth start and to help our new families we have given some pointers below for navigating around our school.

Te Kura o Maungatapu encourages active modes of transport to support a healthy lifestyle.

Please remember to practise safe parking behaviour, obey the road rules, and choose safety over convenience.

- Pre-plan a meeting place with your children away from school to help reduce congestion. Parking areas can be found on Sunset Crescent, Ririnui Place and Vine Avenue. A great park and stride option or walking school bus can be at the top parking bay on Maungatapu Road
- Bike, walk, scooter to school to help reduce congestion, be fit and healthy.
- Use the designated new safe school crossing on Maungatapu Road, even if you need to walk a little further.

A reminder -

- No parking on footpaths.
- No stopping or parking on yellow lines.
- No double parking alongside other vehicles to pick up or drop off children.
 Park safely. Parking on grass verges can make it difficult for children to see and be seen.
